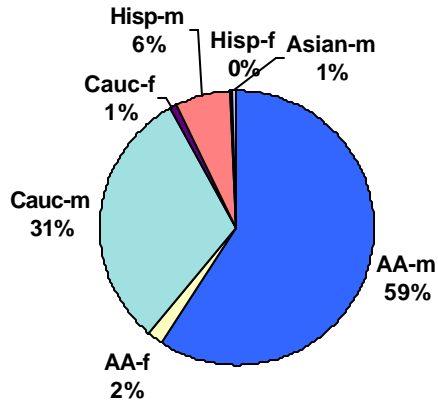


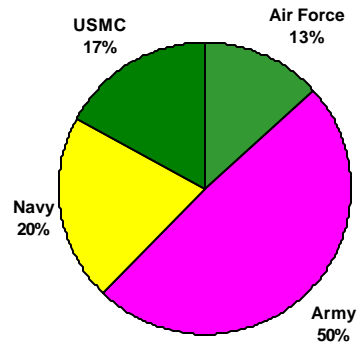
U.S. VETS DEMOGRAPHICS DATA SHEET

Ethnicity



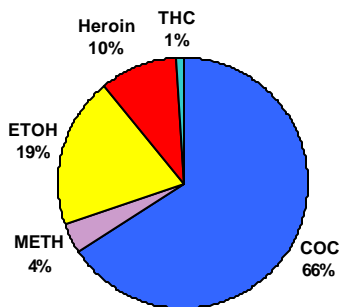

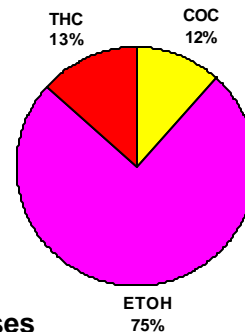

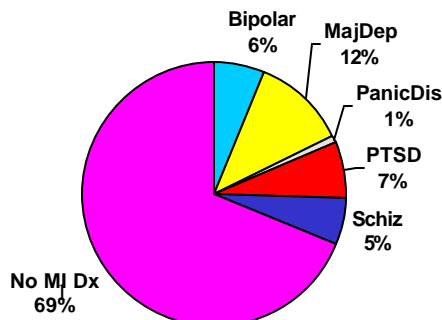
Primary Substance Abuse Problem

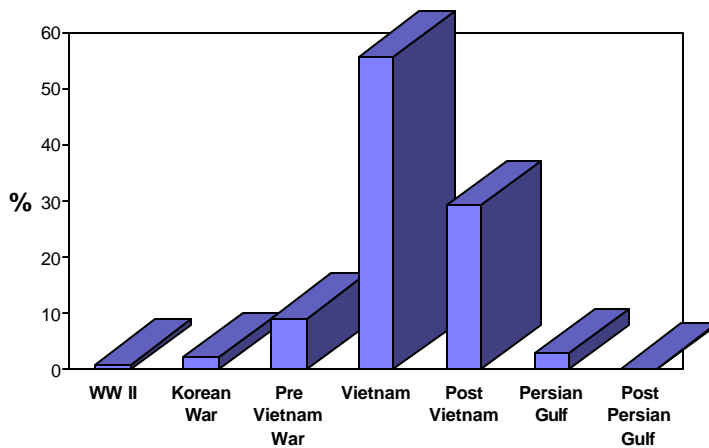

Provisional Summary

- Westside residents are predominately male, the majority are African-American.
- Women residents are younger than the male residents are.
- Almost 2/3 of residents have children, over 40% with minor children (women vets are much less likely to have children).
- When viewed according to service branch or gender and ethnicity, the mean years of education are closely similar across all groups except for modest increase in the Caucasian women.
- Mean length of stay is almost 8 months, median length of stay is approximately 5 months. African-American women and Hispanic men tend to stay 25% less time at the facility.
- Both African-American and Caucasian women have lower exit income levels than their male counterparts.
- Residents are predominately of the Vietnam and post Vietnam era.
